Local favorite Bottles & Cans to kick-off spring Jepson Live

[Savannah, Georgia] — The Telfair Museum of Art announced today that its popular music series Jepson Live will move from Friday to Thursday evenings beginning in March. Held the second week of each month at the Telfair's Jepson Center for the Arts, the program features live music by a variety of area talent. To kick-off the event on its new night, Savannah's own Bottles & Cans will perform on March 12 from 5-8pm.

Bottles & Cans—consisting of RayRay "BlackBelly" Lundy (Vocals/Guitar), Mike "The Butcher" Walker (Bass), Marty "Lock Jaw" Ellis (Harmonica/Vocals), and Jason "Noodles" Gecik (Drums/Vocals)—has been entertaining Savannah and the Low Country with its mesmerizing blend of blues, rock, and swing for the past five years. Galvanizing its audiences with a lively selection of original and obscure material, the versatile foursome boasts a diverse range of talents and influences—including Tom Waits, Junior Wells, Charlie Musselwhite, Stuart Copeland, Mitch Mitchell, John Bonham, Gene Krupa, and Canned Heat.

Bring your friends and join us for a fun evening of food, drinks, and music in a uniquely artistic setting. All galleries will be open for viewing during the evening's festivities.

Don't miss the exhibitions *Elizabeth King: The Sizes of Things in the Mind's Eye*— featuring innovative installations of figurative sculpture and stop-frame film animation that blur the boundary between art and reality—and *Robert Colescott: Troubled Goods*—which includes a selection of racially and culturally provocative paintings spanning the artist's career.

About the Telfair

Located in the heart of Savannah’s historic district, the Telfair Museum of Art is the oldest public art museum in the South. It is comprised of two National Historic Landmark Buildings—the Telfair Academy and the Owens-Thomas House—and the contemporary Jepson Center for the Arts. With three unique buildings housing three distinct collections, the Telfair bridges three centuries of art and architecture.

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The Telfair Museum of Art is supported by its members, with partial support of the annual operating fund provided by the City of Savannah and by the Georgia Council for the Arts through the appropriations of the Georgia General Assembly.

The Telfair Academy is located on Telfair Square at 121 Barnard Street, Savannah, GA. The Jepson Center is also located on Telfair Square, just steps from the Academy building, at 207 W. York Street. The Telfair’s Owens-Thomas House is located at 124 Abercorn Street on Oglethorpe Square. General admission (which includes a one-time visit to each of the Telfair’s three sites) is \$15 for adults; \$12 for seniors, military personnel, and AAA members; \$5 for K-12 students; children under 5 are free. Members are always admitted free.

The Telfair’s Jepson Center for the Arts and Telfair Academy are open Sunday 12-5 pm, Monday, Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday 10 am-5 pm, Tuesday-Closed, and Thursday 10 am-8 pm. Call 912.790.8880 for Owens-Thomas House hours or visit www.telfair.org. Museum sites are closed some holidays.

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
